

#### MYLES KNUDSON SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

These scholarships are based on 50% academic and 50% bowling activities and are administered by the USBC - SMART program. Any graduating high school senior who meets the following criteria is eligible for consideration:

- Is currently a Bismarck-Mandan USBC league member in good standing.
- Files a complete application with the Bismarck-Mandan USBC Association by the deadline of February 1.

### Application Procedure

Complete and sign **Page 3**; be sure to prepare a list of your tournament awards. Complete and sign **Page 4**.

Write an essay on the topic "Bowling - Its Role for Me and My Ideas to Promote Greater Youth Involvement." The essay should be 500 - 600 words and describe the impact bowling has made on you, any impact you feel you have made to the sport, and finally, what can be done to increase participation in the sport. Your essay will be judged on content and presentation. **Applications submitted without an essay will not be considered.** 

Submit your completed **Page 3**, tournament award listing, essay, and **Page 4** to Association Manager Sheila McClenathan, 1511 N. 23rd St, Bismarck, ND 58501 by **February 1**. If possible, please provide a photograph for publicity purposes.

Give **Page 5** to a school official or counselor by **January 15**. Ask them to complete the page and submit it, along with a copy of your transcript, to Sheila McClenathan by **February 1**. You may be required to sign an authorization form and/or pay a small fee for the transcript.

Prior to February 1, feel free to check with Sheila McClenathan at 258-7027 or bismanusbc@midco.net to ensure all parts of your application have been received.

The Bismarck-Mandan USBC Association Board of Directors determines who receives these scholarships. Their decision is final.

#### **MYLES KNUDSON**

Myles Knudson (1925-1982) always had a keen interest in bowling. In 1940, while attending high school, he had a part-time job as a pin-setter. After graduating from high school in 1943, Myles left bowling for a short period of time. He served in the U. S. Marine Corps during World War II until 1946. He then attended the North Dakota State School of Science at Wahpeton, ND. After graduating from NDSSS, Myles returned to Mandan and bowling.

In 1947 he became a member of the Bismarck-Mandan Bowling Association. Over the years he held the offices of league president and secretary many times. From 1960-1965 Myles served as a Director for the Bismarck-Mandan Bowling Association. Myles also served as President for the 1965-66 season. In 1965 Myles became a Director for the Bismarck-Mandan Junior Bowling Association, and he served as President during the late 60's. When Ten Spot Lanes (Mandan) opened in 1968, Myles became coowner. In 1974, he was inducted into the Bismarck-Mandan Bowling Association's Hall of Fame. That same year he became a charter member of the North Dakota Bowling Council, serving as President of that organization from 1974-1976. In 1976, Myles became a Director for the North Dakota American Junior Bowling Congress. Up to the time of his death, Myles continued to be very active in the different bowling organizations.

Not only was Myles an avid bowling supporter, he was a very capable bowler. Throughout his bowling career he won numerous league championships as well as many tournament titles, both locally and on the state level. He won titles in tournaments sponsored by the Bismarck-Mandan Bowling Association, North Dakota Bowling Association, North Dakota Elks, North Dakota Knights of Columbus, and the North Dakota Bowling Proprietors Association. Myles held a 200 average for four seasons, his highest being a 205 during the 1974-75 season. That same year he recorded 13 sanctioned 700 series. His high sanctioned scores were a 280 game, 765 3-game series, and a 967 4-game series. On Christmas Eve 1978 he rolled a 300 game during open play. Over his bowling career, he recorded more than thirty sanctioned 700 3-game series.

Myles was also a warm family man and a very active civic supporter. He and his wife Elva had eight children, some being active junior bowling members for many years. Myles served as president and secretary of the Mandan Lions Club, a grand knight and faithful navigator of Third and Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus, and a charter member of the Mandan Moose Lodge. At the time of his death, he was the western North Dakota District Governor for Lions International.

Myles Knudson was an exceptionally active person who unbelievably always had time for everyone. When the Bismarck-Mandan Junior Bowling Association initiated the scholarship program during the 1981-82 season, Myles served on the organization committee and also volunteered to solicit the support of all Mandan organizations.

We are honored to name our scholarship after such an exemplary individual.
